#### Mountain Valley Economic Opportunity Authority

(MVEOA) A division of the East Tennessee Human Resource Agency (ETHRA) administers the CSBG grant in the following counties: Campbell, Claiborne, Morgan, Scott, and Union. **The Community Service Block Grant (CSBG)** is funded through a contract with the Tennessee Department of Human Services (TDHS), which assists with utilities and other needs to support family self-sufficiency in the low-income population as a designated Community Action Agency. Assistance in the form of vouchers paid to the vendor for past due utility assistance, which may be electric, natural gas, water, or past due rent/mortgage payments. Applicants must have experienced a loss of income or portion of income within the past 30 days or experienced an unexpected documented expense. Housing assistance may be provided in the form of current or past due rent/mortgage payments, rent deposits, first month's rent, utility deposits, and current or past due utility assistance. Health assistance with prescriptions for non-narcotic, life-sustaining medication, medical items such as glasses, dentures or other dental needs, and hearing aids. Food assistance is also provided by CSBG staff through quarterly Commodities food distributions. This food is provided by United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Tennessee Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). Employment assistance provides help with purchasing special items or equipment needed to obtain a job. CSBG staff work with WIOA and Families First to assist those in need to secure or maintain employment. Education assistance with testing fees, tuition, books, uniforms, or school supplies may be provided in this component. CSBG staff also provide intake services for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).

**Tennessee Association of Community Action Agencies** (**TACA**) East Tennessee Human Resource Agency is a member of the Tennessee Association of Community Action Agencies. Human Resource Agencies were authorized by Chapter 289 of the Public Acts of 1973 and operates under the authority of the amended TCA Title 13 Chapter 26. Nine (9) HRA's function within the same geographic area as development districts which encompasses all 95 counties in Tennessee. By this legislation, Human Resource Agencies are directed to be the primary service deliverer for the Department of Human Services.

ETHRA's designated service delivery area is the sixteen counties of: Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Claiborne, Cocke, Grainger, Hamblen, Jefferson, Knox, Loudon, Monroe, Morgan, Roane, Scott, Sevier, Union; with programs in additional counties of: Bradley, Fentress, Greene, Hancock, Hawkins, Jackson, McMinn, Meigs, Putnam, and Warren.

The ETHRA Board consists of the sixteen (16) County Mayors/Executives, three (3) Municipal Mayors selected by the County Mayors/Executives and two (2) members of the General Assembly.

The ETHRA Board meets monthly (normally on the second Tuesday of the month) as well as one meeting annually to consider approval of the Executive Director's Annual Report, the Agency Work Programs, the Proposed Annual Budget and the election of officers for the next fiscal year.

Other Boards within ETHRA are Workforce, Mountain Valley Economic Opportunity Authority (MVEOA), ETAAAD Council on Aging and Disability, and Correctional Services.




### **ETHRA and Lakeway Transit Fixed Bus Route Service**

My story is about a time when I was able to help a lady named Ms. S. and her household. She came into the office seeking help with an electric bill. If she wasn't able to get assistance, her utilities would be disconnected and she was in fear of losing their home if this happened. After some life-altering events, there was no income in the household. Ms. S. found out about ETHRA and contacted me. She did not know that ETHRA had services to help with utilities and other needs. After helping Ms. S. with the LIHEAP application, their household was approved. Ms. S. was so fearful and upset when she came into our office but soon left less stressed and happy. I am so glad that we can make a positive difference in their life!

He had insurance but the eye exam would not be covered. He had a limited income and stated he had no way to pay for the prescription or exam. We helped him make an appointment and it was discovered that he had cataracts in both eyes. CSBG was able to help pay for the costs of the eye exam and thankfully, his insurance paid for the surgery. Mr. E. told us later that he can see so much better and had he not contacted the ETHRA office for glasses, then he would have never known about the cataracts.

I also gave her a list of other resources in the county to assist her with various areas of support. Ms. A. was approved for not only mortgage assistance but we also helped her with heating assistance, water assistance and partner resources. It is clients such as Ms. A. that make my job a true blessing.

At first, I helped her with the rental deposit thru CSBG Housing Program. At the time, I didn't realize I could also help with CSBG and the Jane Pettway program. I asked and my supervisor told me that we/ETHRA could help in this area as well. Because Ms. K. was a single female with no dependents or other family members, she qualified for the Jane Pettway Program. I was then able to use these funds to get the electricity turned on in her new home. Ms. K. now has a real home to sleep in and no longer in her car!

When she left our office, she was in tears. Ms. K. had finally obtained some stability and she was so very grateful.

I love my job. I love what we do. I love seeing the smiles on our client's faces when we are able to help them. Being able to touch the lives of those in need and having even just a small impact in their lives is rewarding!

She had recently divorced and was only given a short time to vacate of what had been a long-term home for her. Additionally, we discovered they were having trouble making ends meet with adequate nutrition. After meeting with them, and learning that their income qualified them for LIHEAP assistance. We were successful in getting this assistance but also worked diligently and got their electricity turned back on while they were in the office.

While we then began to gather resources, list of other area partners in the community to help, our staff gathered food for them. We then contacted the ETHRA Office on Aging to help them with emergency food. We were able to fill their refrigerator and assist them with future nutritional needs.

The clients saw everything that we had done for them and thanked us and Mr. J. signed to me *"thank you so much for helping us with the electric and for bringing us food.."* 

Mr. J. and Ms. L left more at ease and immediately made a forever connection to our staff at the office when they learned that I could communicate via sign language. Their faces lit up and it was the most precious thing I had ever seen!
