#### Mountain Valley Economic Opportunity Authority (MVEOA)

A division of East Tennessee Human Resource Agency (ETHRA) administers the CSBG grant in the following counties: Campbell, Claiborne, Morgan, Scott and Union. Community Service Block Grant provides emergency food, housing, utilities and other emergency needs to support family self-sufficiency in low income population as a designated Community Action Agency. Emergency assistance in the form of vouchers paid to the vendor for past due utility assistance which may be electric, natural or propane gas, water, or past due rent/mortgage payments. Applicants must have experienced a loss income or a portion of income within the past 30 days or experienced an unexpected documented expense. Housing assistance may be provided in the form of rent/mortgage payments and utility deposits. CSBG staff provide intake services for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program. Health assists individuals who are elderly and/or disabled with prescription drugs for non-narcotic life-sustaining medication, medical items such as braces, canes, hearing aids, glasses and dental needs. Over the counter items such as Ensure and Depends are also included. Assistance with opioid addiction treatment and rehabs through partnership with ETHRA's Community Corrections program. Employment provides assistance with special items or equipment needed to obtain a job. CSBG staff work with WIOA and Families First to assist those in need to secure or maintain

employment. **Education** needs such as testing fees, tuition, books, uniforms and school supplies may be provided in this component. **Nutrition** assistance is provided by CSBG staff at Commodity distributions in each county quarterly. The food is provided by USDA and income guidelines are determined by TEFAP. CSBG staff also assists ETHRA's home delivered meal program by delivering meals to elderly/disabled shut-ins in the community.

#### **Tennessee Association of Community Action Agencies (TACA)**

East Tennessee Human Resource Agency is a member of the Tennessee Association of Community Action Agencies. TACA, the Tennessee Association of Community Action, is the professional membership organization for the state's 20 Community Action Agencies. TACA serves its members with training and technical assistance, facilitating collaboration, resource development, and by leading statewide efforts to increase public awareness of Tennesseans in poverty and the strategies and solutions to improve their lives and communities.

#### Tennessee Association of Human Resource Agencies (TAHRA)

East Tennessee Human Resource Agency is a member of the Tennessee Association of Human Resource Agencies. Since the beginning of the Human Resource Agencies in 1974, our association (TAHRA) has established an effective statewide network to deliver social services to our communities. Every day we help more Tennesseans become self-sufficient through the effective delivery of financial support, job training, transportation, nutritional services, and many other important social services to our friends and neighbors in need. Our proven track record delivering a broad selection of programs, our strong and experienced network of employees and volunteers, and our cost-effective administrative structure make us your best choice to deliver hope to your community. #### **ETHRAs Board and Policy Council**

The oversite structure for ETHRA is established through The Human Resource Agency Act of 1973. The duties and the members of the governing bodies are identified within that legislation. The 9 HRAs statewide follow the same board structure.

The Policy Council members meet monthly (normally on the second Tuesday) and include sixteen providers, sixteen resource representatives, one At-Large member appointed by the Board Chair, and two members from the General Assembly. Members are selected by their respective County and City Mayors and confirmed by the Council.

The Board of Directors meets annually and includes every City Mayor and every County Mayor, Development Representatives, plus two members from the General Assembly. Board and Council meetings are held in coordination with the East Tennessee Development District. This combined meeting offers members a wider opportunity to discuss issues concerning the 16 county governments. Special advisory groups provide an important community partnership link with the Executive Director. They include Workforce, Mountain Valley Economic Opportunity Authority, Council on Aging and Disability, and Correctional Services.

# **East Tennessee Human Resource Agency Governing Board and Policy Council**

The East Tennessee Human Resource Agency, Inc. (ETHRA) has two separate governing bodies. Although some members serve on both groups, there are differences in the way members are selected, as well as in the functions of the two bodies.

The ETHRA "GOVERNING BOARD" has the same membership as the board of the East Tennessee

Development District (ETDD). It is composed of all City Mayors and County Executives/Mayors in the region, representatives concerned with development of human resources, and members of the TennesseeGeneral Assembly. At present this group has approximately 90 members, and meets once eachyear.

ETHRA'S POLICY COUNCIL can have up to 35 members, including two from each county and two members of the General Assembly and a Member-at-Large. The Policy Council is the group responsible for agency operation. Members of this group are nominated by the County Executive/Mayor, approved by the majority of County Executive/Mayor and Mayors in that county, and appointed by the Governing Board at its Annual Meeting each year. The Policy Council is designated to act for the Governing Board.



#### **AGING**

#### CHILD DEVELOPMENT

**Child Care Food for Homes** assists licensed Family Home Day Cares, Group Home Day Cares and Unregulated Home Day Cares that care for four or fewer unrelated children. The program provides help with meal planning and monthly food expenses.

Child Care Food for Day Care Centers assists by providing nutritious meals to children in facilities. The program provides assistance to the day care facility with approving income applications, meal planning and monthly food expenses.

At Risk Supper Program assists schools that have a free or reduced meal percentage of 50% or more; that have an education or enrichment after school program for ages 2-18, regardless of income.

Summer Food insures that children have good, nutritious meals during the summer when school meals are not available.

#### **HOUSING & RESTORATION**

Low Income Home Energy Assistance helps eligible households in meeting their immediate home energy needs. Most are paying a large portion of their income for heating and cooling.

Weatherization assists low-income households in reducing their fuel costs and contributes to national energy conservation through increased energy efficiency and consumer education.

**Housing Choice Voucher** (rental assistance) helps low income families obtain safe and sanitary housing at an affordable price.

**Community Corrections** was created to divert felony offenders from the Tennessee prison system and provide necessary supervision and service to the offenders with the goal of reducing the probability of continued criminal behavior while focusing on the safety of the community.

Community Intervention provides intensive supervision to juvenile offenders while allowing these offenders to remain in their home and community. Providing supervision at home reduces the number of commitments to state custody which creates significant savings in state dollars.

**Misdemeanor Probation** is offered to counties at no cost to the government or taxpayers, operating entirely on fees collected from offenders. The program diverts offenders from the court system and provides necessary supervision and resources to help the clients become more productive in the community, reducing the probability of continual criminal behavior. Staff monitors the payment of court costs and fines, drug screening, in-patient and out-patient treatment classes, education, DUI classes and job search.

**DUI Education Class** uses the Prime for Life curriculum which is the only DUI curriculum accepted by the State of Tennessee to reinstate a driver's license that has been revoked.



Karen and the homemaker team serve and assist adult and child/family cases referred to ETHRA by Adult Protective Services and Child Protec-


tive Services. Homemaker clients are some of the most vulnerable of all those whom ETHRA assists. Everyone who knows Karen knows she puts her heart into her work.

# **East Tennessee Human Resource Agency Community Corrections Program**

In 1985, Tennessee Legislators created Community Corrections Programs to reduce prison overcrowding. Community Corrections Programs supervise felony offenders in the community and provides supervision and services with the goal of reducing the probability of continued criminal behavior while maintaining the safety of the community. The program is funded through a grant and request for grant proposal (RFGP) system supervised by the TN Department of Corrections.

ETHRA supervises 1,235 felony offenders in 6 Judicial Districts and 19 counties as of December 31, 2019. The Community Corrections Officers monitor payments of court costs, fines and restitution. We also collect supervision and community corrections fees and monitor that clients are working and supporting their families. Staff members provided Cognitive Behavior Intervention Program and Alcohol and Drug Education classes and also monitor client progress while they are attending inpatient and outpatient treatment programs for substance abuse problems. Drug testing is performed and other special conditions are monitored according to court orders. Many of ETHRA staff members are also part of drug court treatment teams in our area and work very closely with the drug court staff. We provide all services possible as ordered by the courts and specified by the contract. We perform a one-year follow-up on all successfully terminated clients. During last fiscal year, 97% of these successful clients continued to be successful as they did not return to the criminal justice system.

We are currently in the third year of a three year contract which expires on June 30, 2020. Staff meets quarterly as required by the contract with local Advisory Boards. Members of those local boards are the County Mayors and Executives, Sheriffs, District Attorney General, Public Defender, TDOC Probation and Parole Officers, Judges, Court staff and interested community citizens. These members are specified by the Act that set up the Program. For over 33 years, we have provided the services to felony offenders that would be in local jails and state prisons with less than 10% of successful offenders returning to the system within the one year follow-up. The 18 Community Corrections Program across the state, supervise approximately 8,000 offenders and they supervise at \$5 per day versus the higher costs of prison at \$78 per day. Community Corrections programs have saved millions of dollars for Tennessee tax payers through the years. There is really no way to measure the savings when you see families remaining together and offenders successfully completing the program.



# **2019 TN Elder Justice Conference**

#### City of Morristown Fixed Route Bus Service

The East Tennessee Human Resource Agency (ETHRA) and the Lakeway Area Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization (LAMTPO) in cooperation with the City of Morristown and the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) participated in a fixed-route bus study and analysis authorized by TDOT and conducted by AECOM.

The study provided a unique opportunity to understand the potential for a fixed-route bus service in the Morristown portion of the urbanized area. As a result of the planning process it was determined that three fixed routes, operating on 30-minutes headways, would best serve the needs for the initial bus service in the Morristown community with future expansions to Jefferson City and White Pine.

The three fixed routes were recommended in order to improve mobility options for the Morristown residents, with each one serving distinct activity centers in regions of the city. The routes are envisioned to function as a comprehensive transit system, allowing multiple connections to residential, employment and shopping opportunities.

The projected implementation date is March/April 2020.

#### Tennessee Department of Transportation Bus Grant Award

The East Tennessee Human Resource Agency was successful in our competitive bus replacement application and was awarded \$1,642,034 for the replacement of 42 demand response vehicles for the replacement of vehicles that has met their useful life.

ETHRA was awarded \$1,642,034 for the purchase of replacement vehicles within the East Tennessee region.

#### Statewide Application Bus Application funded by DOT

The Tennessee Public Transportation Association and the Tennessee Department of Transportation submitted an application to the U.S. Department of Transportation on behalf of 10 transit association members for bus replacements. The U.S. Department of Transportation awarded TPTA and TDOT \$16.2 million dollars for the replacement of 25 buses and

279 demand response vehicles to replace existing vehicles that have met their useful life. Tennessee's application received full funding and received one of the top eight highest-funded awards in the country out of 94 recipients that submitted applications.



ETHRA was awarded \$2,709,000 for the purchase of 45 vehicles within the East Tennessee region.
